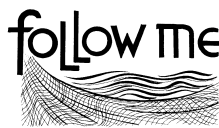

Advanced Notice. Tuesday 29 June is the feast of Sts Peter and Paul, a Holy day of Obligation and a joyful celebration in our Catholic Church, when we recognise the two most famous foundation stones of the Church. **There will be no mass in any of our schools.** Mass will be at 9.15am. to which pupils from any of our schools may attend. High School pupils will be registered in Church; Primary school pupils will be registered in school when they arrive after mass. Other Parish Masses will be a vigil mass 7.15pm on Monday 28 June; a 12.15pm mass; evening mass on Tuesday 29 June. NO 8am MASS THAT DAY. With mass in our two prisons each Priest will celebrate his maximum masses of three that day.

WORD OF LIFE

Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it (Mt 10:39)

By following Jesus' commandments, which are all centred on love, after this brief life, we will find eternal life as well. Let's remember what Jesus' judgement will be on the Last Day. He will say to those on his right: 'Come, you that are blessed . . . for I was hungry and you gave me food . . . I was a stranger and you welcomed me, was naked and you gave me clothing (Mt 25:34-36). To make us sharers of the existence that does not pass away, he will only look to see whether we have loved our neighbours, and he will consider as done to himself whatever we have done to them.
