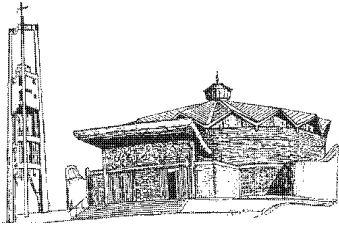

WORD OF LIFE

The kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it. (Matt. 13: 45-46)

In this very brief parable Jesus caught the imagination of his listeners. Everyone realised the value of pearls. Together with gold, they were the most precious goods known at the time. In addition, the Scriptures spoke of wisdom, that is, of the knowledge of God, as something that could not be likened 'to any priceless gem' (Wis. 7: 9). But what stands out in this parable is how strange, surprising and unexpected it would have been for the merchant to come across a pearl. Perhaps it was in a bazaar and only an expert eye could tell its enormous value and the huge profit to be made from it. This is why, when everything had been weighed up, it was worth selling all to buy the pearl. And who would not have done the same thing? So the profound meaning of the parable is this: the meeting with Jesus (that is, with the kingdom of God among us - this is the pearl!) is a unique opportunity. We must seize it while we can, giving all our energies and all we possess.

Saint John Rigbye (c. 1570 - June 21, 1600) English martyr executed during the reign of Elizabeth I. He is one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. Born at Harrock Hall, Eccleston, the fifth or sixth son of Nicholas Rigby, John was working for Sir Edmund Huddleston, whose daughter Mrs. Fortescue was summoned to the Old Bailey for recusancy. Because she was ill, Rigby appeared for her, was compelled to confess his Catholicism, and sent to Newgate.

The next day, February 14, 1600, he signed a confession saying that since he had been reconciled by Saint John Jones, a Franciscan, he had not attended Anglican services. He was chained and sent back to Newgate, until he was transferred to the White Lion. Twice he was given the chance to recant, but twice he piously refused. His sentence was therefore ordered to be carried out. On his way to execution, the hurdle was stopped by Roger Manners, 5th Earl of Rutland, who wished him to confirm if he were married, to which the martyr replied, "I am a bachelor; and more than that I am a maid." The Earl then asked Rigby for his prayers. Rigby was executed by hanging at St. Thomas Waterings on June 21, 1600, and was canonized in 1970
