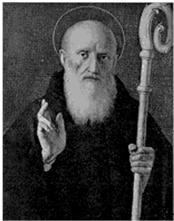

HOLY COMMUNION FOR THE SICK

Dear Parishioners, Thank you for giving me such a wonderful celebration of 40 years of priesthood last Sunday. It was truly a graced celebration, both the mass and the time on the lawn afterwards. I felt in a "whirl of God's Love" with so many friends around me, and five members of my lovely family too. May I thank you all for being such an important part of my life. I would have liked to greet each one of you personally and I tried but I am conscious of not doing so. Please do not think that those to whom I did not speak are not important - each one of you is important to me, and so together we will go ahead. I got such lovely presents too: the money has come now to more than £1500! I am amazed. Somebody asked what will I do with that money. I want to ask Fr. Abbot if it will be possible to use it to go to the Holy Land again next year on an ecumenical pilgrimage in March. It is organised by an Anglican friend in the focolare movement, and the first one I went on had an enormous influence on me, especially seeing the country where Jesus lived, and his living presence among those who live there, those who want to live in unity, (he is present where people are united in his name) Palestinian Christians in the main, but also Moslems and Jews. By the way if anyone from the parish is interested in going on this pilgrimage the dates are Thursday 15th March to Thursday 22nd March 2012. The cost (all in except for travel) is c. £600. Please contact Fr. Jonathan. Plates from the lunch can be collected from the table in the Narthex.

Future Changes Fr. Abbot has asked Fr. Stephen to leave us for one year to be the Priest in charge of Knaresborough. This will leave from Ampleforth only two of us, Fr. Jonathan and Fr. Paul. Maybe some other priest, not a member of our Ampleforth community, will be able to come and help us but this is by no means certain. Therefore there will have to be major changes in the future and we will discuss things with the PPC to see how best to manage. I am sure with the help of all we will be able to cope, but it may not be to the liking of some as what we have been used to will no longer be the case. This is a new challenge for us, and will mean a greater trust in God by us all.

WORD OF LIFE

Stay awake and pray that you may not come into the time of trial; the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak. (Mt 26:41)

These words, seen in context, are more than a warning to his disciples. They are a reflection of Jesus' state of mind. They show how he was preparing himself for the trial. Facing his imminent passion, he prayed, with all his strength and all his soul, wrestling with the fear and horror of death, casting himself upon the love of the Father in order to be faithful to the end to his will, and helping his apostles do the same. We see Jesus here as the model for those who have to face trials and, at the same time, as the brother who stands by our side in those difficult times.
