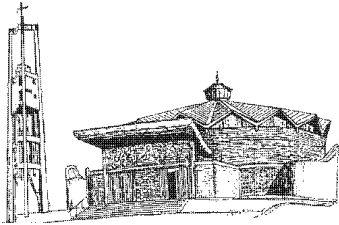

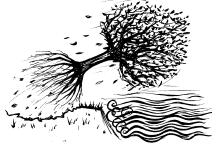

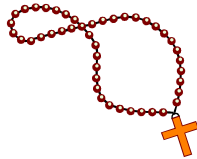

WORD OF LIFE

You shall love your neighbour as yourself (Mt 22:39)

This Word of Life can be found already in the Hebrew Scriptures (Lv 19:18). In replying to a question, Jesus gave his answer in line with the great tradition of the prophets and rabbis who had sought the unifying principle of the Torah, that is, God's teaching in the Bible. Rabbi Hillel once said: "What is hateful to you, do not do to your neighbour: that is the whole Torah, while the rest is the commentary." The Jewish teachers considered love of neighbour to be a consequence of loving God who created human beings in his image and likeness. So it is not possible to love God without loving the people he has made. This is the real motive for love of neighbour, and it is 'a great and general principle of the Torah.'
