Family of Parishes Consultation: Last September/October, everyone in our 4 parishes was invited to join in the conversation about how our family of parishes could work together more closely as we move into the future. Thank you for the feedback you gave.

We imagine that we will likely have only 2 priests for our Family of Parishes within 5 years and this will have consequences for the number of Masses in our 5 churches, and the sacramental & pastoral provision in the 4 parishes, 7 schools, 2 prisons etc. We recognise that there has been a significant change in the practice of our Catholic communities and schools.

The working group identified a number of key points that will apply to all the scenarios:

- Reduce the number of Mass times – one Sunday Mass (either vigil, morning, or evening) in each church, and one weekday Mass each day within the Family;
- Expand lay ministry and ensure training for lay ministry;
- Utilise land, buildings, & investments to fund the chosen plan;
- Each scenario has to be financially viable and sustainable into the future without central diocesan funding.

Summary of the 4 possible scenarios - see the Family of Parishes Scenario document for more detail:

1. Four individual parishes with a priest & deacon serving 2 parishes each;
2. Four individual parishes with dedicated lay leadership in each parish, and a team of priests & deacons serving the 4 parishes;
3. Four parishes collaborating & coordinating closely on everything with a team ministry of priests, deacons, and other lay ministers serving the whole;
4. One parish with one ministry & leadership team serving the 5 church communities.

Journey in Faith (RCIA) – Update February 2026

It is a real blessing to report that our Family of Parishes Journey in Faith RCIA course is now in 'full swing' and continues to meet each Wednesday evening at St Mary's Community Centre, Leyland.

We have a wonderful group of 15 participants and a supportive team of parishioners and clergy to accompany them, as they journey towards being received into full communion with our Catholic community this Easter.

Their commitment to the sessions, despite the winter weather, has been really encouraging and we are journeying together as a community of faith with friendships being made and a real sense of togetherness.

We continue to follow the resources and videos of the **Sycamore course** (www.sycamore.fm) which offers very clear teaching on the essential of Catholic belief and a great range of discussion questions drawing on people's real life experience of religion and faith.

One of the participants shared that they had expected the course to be a bit like a 'Sunday School for grown-ups'. They have however been pleasantly surprised that it offers a much more engaging and interactive experience inviting deep reflection and an opportunity to discuss and question many aspects of our beliefs and practice.

In recent weeks we have been focusing on the Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Holy Communion and Confirmation, and have also considered the power of prayer and the riches of the bible.

Many of the group will be heading to Liverpool Metropolitan Cathedral on the 22nd February for the 'Rite of Election' service. This significant liturgy, celebrated on the first Sunday of Lent each year, marks a key moment for all those in the Diocese who are journeying towards full sacramental initiation into the Catholic Church.

Please continue to keep a special place in your prayers for the 15 participants as they journey in faith.
