OUR WAY OF LIFE Jesus is transfigured showing something of his true person, the Word of God made flesh. The divine and the human are united, and this has affected the whole of creation including human beings.

A REFLECTION. Yet Jesus, all powerful Word of God through whom all things were made becomes "a nobody, a worm and no man" to save the world by his cross. He taught us without hesitation to love each other and everyone including enemies. What a contrast in the tragic massacre of 40 of our brother Muslims in New Zealand on Friday last, and the hatred that divides our own country. Let us do something about it. If you meet a Muslim man or woman, be friendly and welcoming. Why not come to the Prayer Service called for by Churches together of Britain and Ireland on Friday week about our Political situation? Or pray to God personally; he answers prayers!

WORD OF LIFE **Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful** (Lk 6:36). God the Father wants to relate to us: he reminds us of our responsibilities but at the same time his love heals, nourishes and takes care of us. His attitude is motherly, compassionate and tender. This is the mercy of God who reaches out personally to every human being in their weakness and fragility. In fact, God prefers those who are excluded, rejected and on the periphery of society. Mercy is a love that fills our hearts and then flows out to others, to neighbours as well as strangers, to society around us. Since we are children of God, we can imitate and resemble him in his characteristic way of loving - by accepting and welcoming others and knowing how to wait until others are ready to accept this love.

Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

Unfortunately, in our personal and social lives we breathe an atmosphere of growing hostility and competition, of mutual suspicion, judgment and fear of others. Grudges accumulate and lead to conflicts and wars. As Christians, we can give a clear witness of refusing to be swept along by these negative attitudes. We can try to be free from ourselves and from outside circumstances, and begin to rebuild the weakened or broken bonds in our family, workplace, parish community, political party or country.
