OUR WAY OF LIFE. God the Father is utter Love. The story of the Father in the Prodigal Son Parable makes that clear from its start to the finish.

A REFLECTION. Whatever situation we are in, the Church is our Mother. The Church is where Jesus is alive and therefore we can rest assured that the Father's Love comes to us in and through the Church. Whatever needs we may have, Mother Church is there to support and help us in the one way that is essential, reconciliation to God and each other. The Church also helps us in many other practical ways.

WORD OF LIFE "So if I, your Lord and teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet" (Jn. 13:14).

When recalling the last few hours spent with Jesus before his death, John the Evangelist focuses on the washing of the feet. In the past, in the Middle East, this was a sign of welcome towards guests who had arrived after travelling on dusty roads. It was an action usually performed by servants.

It was for this very reason that the disciples at first did not want to let their teacher do this. However, he then explained, "If I, your Lord and teacher have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet".
