OUR WAY OF LIFE The way we become a community in Christ is by receiving the Eucharist. Only the Word of God, Jesus himself present body, blood, soul and divinity can make us One in the Mystical Body of Christ. Therefore it is not possible for Catholic Christians not to worship God together by uniting with Jesus at least weekly in Mass. He enables us not to remain self-centred but empty of self to receive the Holy Spirit of Jesus.

A REFLECTION. It seems fewer and fewer are coming to Mass! But that does not take away the importance of the Eucharist. Seeing the wonderful closeness of God to us in the consecrated bread and wine we begin to understand how loving God is. The light of the Crucifixion shines on us; the Word of God humbled himself to be a helpless victim of humanity's sinfulness on the cross. Only the divine mind could have invented the Eucharist, this way of remaining with us, drawing us into his love each week. He is at our disposal, helpless and hidden, and yet He is the all-powerful Word of God "through whom all things were made". Coming faithfully to mass each Sunday evangelises others in the Body of Christ for we all need constant help and support of good example, as well as helping us to understand our need for the Bread of Life.

WORD OF LIFE "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses." (Acts 1:18)

All Christians receive the gift of the Holy Spirit when they are baptized. But the Spirit also speaks in the conscience of all those who sincerely seek what is good and true. That is why all of us can make room in our lives for the spirit of God and allow ourselves to be guided.

How can we recognize and listen to the Holy Spirit?

This thought by Chiara Lubich can help us: "The Holy Spirit dwells in us as in a temple, giving us light and guidance. He is the spirit of truth who enables us to understand the words of Jesus, making them come alive and showing their relevance. The Holy Spirit helps us fall in love with wisdom and suggests what we might say and how to say it.
