St James feast day on Thursday was the brother of John the Apostle and was one of the first disciples to join Jesus. James and John were with their father by the seashore when Jesus called them to follow him. James was one of only three apostles whom Jesus selected to bear witness to his Transfiguration. James and John or their mother asked Jesus to grant them seats on his right and left in his glory. James and his brother wanted to call down fire on a Samaritan town, but were rebuked by Jesus. The Acts of the Apostles records that "Herod the king" had James executed by the sword. There is a contrast to the liberation of Saint Peter; "James died while Peter escaped" is a "mystery of divine providence".

OUR WAY OF LIFE. Abraham seems a wonderful father and husband. His reaction when God's messengers arrived reflects a man who would have treated any visitor the same way. We know from other episodes how obedient he was to God, and to his wife Sarah. He was a humble man who knew that God had chosen him.

A REFLECTION. Jesus tells us that dashing about doing many things, seeing many sights, travelling the world are not the "one thing necessary" in life. The hidden mystery is explained by St Paul, Christ among us. It would be worthwhile discovering that mystery for ourselves, going wherever we hear a hint of it being more fully revealed to us. Saint Mary Magdalen She was a Jewish woman who, according to the four Gospels, travelled with Jesus as one of his followers and was a witness to his crucifixion, burial, and resurrection. She is mentioned by name twelve times in the gospels - more times than most of the apostles! Mary's epithet *Magdalene* most likely means that she came from Magdala, a fishing town on the western shore of the Sea of Galilee. The Gospel of Luke 8:2-3 lists Mary as one of the women who travelled with Jesus and helped support his ministry "out of their resources", indicating that she was probably relatively wealthy. In all four gospels, she is a witness to the crucifixion of Jesus and, in the Gospels of Matthew Mark and Luke she is also present at his burial. All four Gospels identify her, either alone or as a member of a larger group of women, as the first witness to the empty tomb and the first to testify to Jesus' resurrection. During the Middle Ages, Mary Magdalene was confused in western tradition with Mary of Bethany and the unnamed "sinful woman" who anoints Jesus' feet in Luke 7:36-50. This resulted in a widespread but inaccurate belief that she was a repentant prostitute or promiscuous woman. In 1969, the identification of Mary Magdalene with Mary of Bethany and the "sinful woman" was removed from the General Roman Calendar but the view of her as a former prostitute has persisted in popular culture. Mary Magdalene is considered to be a saint by the Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican, and Lutheran churches, with a feast day on July 22.
