OUR WAY OF LIFE. Our Lady shows us the way ahead in regards to the Word of God in the Gospel about the un-named rich man and Lazarus: these words are hers in the Magnificat: *He puts forth his arm in strength and scatters the proud-hearted. He casts the mighty from their thrones and raises the lowly. He fills the starving with good things, sends the rich away empty.* We will learn by making those words our own, finding their meaning and acting accordingly.

A REFLECTION. The gospel parable today always sends a shiver down the spine in case any one of us may be like the rich man who did not bother about Lazarus. After both die, the great impassable gulf between the anonymous rich man and Lazarus is a strong image. God already loves in a special way the destitute, the broken-hearted and others similar to them. Whatever we do to the least of our brothers and sisters we do unto Jesus.

WORD OF LIFE Encourage one another and build up each other. (1 Thess 5:11)

This spirit is what led a group of doctors, nurses, psychologists and other medical specialists, in Palermo, Italy, to help disadvantaged people in their city. This is what they said: "We are a group of Christian doctors and health workers from various Churches. The words of the Gospel urge us to see all people as brothers or sisters, especially those who are ill but have no access to adequate treatment. Our patients include people who have very serious illnesses as well as some who are addicted to gambling or the internet. We see these people in a professional capacity in our own workplaces, thus enhancing the potential of the clinics already present in the area. To maintain contact and share the various needs, we have created a WhatsApp chat, a Facebook page and a network of email addresses.

Although it started recently, our group is already very active. We work a great deal with the immigrant population, in particular the Ghanaian Adventist community in Palermo who are a large and joyful group. Our contact with them enables us to experience the joy of helping one another as brothers and sisters who are children of the one Father."
