OUR WAY OF LIFE. Today at mass we will hear a message from Archbishop Malcolm asking us to continue to play our part in the journey towards Synod 2020 and explaining how we can continue to be involved in the important work of discerning the way ahead for the Church in the Archdiocese of Liverpool. There is a leaflet that explains further the work we have to do together in the coming months. Please read the leaflet carefully. There is also a prayer card that has the themes on it and the Synod Prayer.

A REFLECTION. Today is also Mission Sunday and there will be a retiring collection for those without envelopes. Mission is very much needed in our country, and even primary school children in several of our schools know well they are Missionary disciples. May we adults follow the lead of our children in this case.

WORD OF LIFE *Guard, the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.* Every Christian is a "temple" of the Holy Spirit. This enables us to discover and preserve the "precious gifts" entrusted to us, to make them grow and put them at the service of other people. The first of these "treasures" is faith in the Lord Jesus. We Christians need to awaken this and nourish it with prayer, and then communicate it through the witness of charity. A recently ordained priest told us: "I have been asked to minister to and care for the faithful in a large Catholic parish in a city in Brazil. The social environment is very difficult and often the people I meet do not have a clear religious identity; that is why they participate both in the Mass and in other ancient traditional ceremonies. I know that I am responsible for transmitting the Christian faith in fidelity to the Gospel, but I also want everyone to feel welcomed in the parish. I thought that, to enhance the cultural roots of these people, the celebration of Mass could be more festive and we could use musical instruments typical of their cultures. It is a demanding challenge, but one that makes everyone happy because, instead of dividing the community, it unites us in what we have in common: faith in the God who gives us joy."
