**OUR WAY OF LIFE.** On Remembrance Day we say about all those soldiers and civilians killed in wars "*they gave their yesterdays for our tomorrows*". What will we give today to protect our children tomorrow. Our beautiful faith? Doing all we can to prevent more damage in the pollution of our planet? Or...???

**A REFLECTION.** Ordinary Christian people like us, all over the world are being persecuted and quite often martyred for being disciples of Jesus. For those who hate us it does not matter if a Christian is Catholic, Protestant or Orthodox. As a society we seem to have lost that spark of faith that will help us to pass on that faith joyfully and with conviction, despite all our varied and numerous worries. Those of us who worship together most Sundays should keep doing what we are doing, implore the Holy Spirit to come to our aid and make the necessary adjustments to receive the light in our circumstances about what to do.

**WORD OF LIFE Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep (Rom 12:15).**

Considering these words, Chiara Lubich said,

"To love in a Christian way, we must 'make ourselves one' with every neighbour. ... We can enter as far as possible into their hearts and minds in order truly to understand their needs and share their sufferings and joys. It means 'bending towards' others, somehow becoming them, making ourselves them. This is Christianity. Jesus became man, he became like us, to make us like God. In this way, people feel understood and supported."

This Word of Life is an invitation to put ourselves 'in other people's shoes' as a concrete expression of genuine love. A mother's love is perhaps the best example of how to live this Word of Life. A mother knows how to share happiness with a happy child and cry with the one who is upset, without judging and without prejudice.

**Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep**

There is a secret to living this kind of love and not being wrapped up in our own worries, interests or our own world. We need to strengthen our union with God, our relationship with the One who is the very source of love.
