OUR WAY OF LIFE is to aim for perfect freedom when fear disappears. Jesus says quite clearly that we should not be frightened when disasters strike us. Easier said than done! Think of our fellows in the Midlands suffering severe floods! Yet there is truth in these hard sayings. Even we who on the whole have not suffered extreme disasters can understand the comfort and power of having Jesus himself close by us. Sometimes we might even experience in small ways staying calm in the middle of difficult circumstances.

A REFLECTION. All these thoughts point to how we can become more and more fully the human beings we are meant to be, in control of life only because we leave the control to God himself in whom we strive to trust. The sea, the world and all its peoples might thunder, but the rivers clap their hands and the hills ring out their joy at the presence of the Lord. For the Lord comes to rule with justice and the peoples with fairness.

WORD OF LIFE Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep (Rom 12:15).

There is a secret to living this kind of love and not being wrapped up in our own worries, interests or our own world. We need to strengthen our union with God, our relationship with the One who is the very source of Love. It is said that the crown of a tree often corresponds to the diameter of its roots. It can be the same for us: if we deepen our relationship with God, day by day, we will be more inclined to share the joys and bear the burdens of the people around us. Our heart will open up and become more able to contain all that the neighbour who is with us in the present moment is living. In the same way, love for our neighbour will help us enter even more into a personal relationship with God.
