Two couples had a very deep experience of this. One couple was Christian and the other Muslim and they often shared their problems and hopes together. When Ben became seriously ill, Tatiana and Paolo spent a lot of time in the hospital with Ben's wife, Basma and their two children, until Ben died. Then, even though she was distraught at the loss of her husband, Basma and her Christian friends prayed for another seriously ill person. She knelt on her prayer mat facing in the direction of Mecca. Basma confided to Tatiana and Paolo that, "What makes me happier than anything else is feeling part of a body in which everyone has the good of the others at heart."
