**Our Way of Life** Today is the feast day of the Body and Blood of Christ. St Paul reflecting on what the sacrifice of the cross meant and what happens at the Eucharist (Mass) says it is a communion, a sharing with who Jesus is and what he did. The fact that there is one loaf means that we form a single body.

**A Reflection** Reflecting on the future of the Church after Covid-19 and lockdown An Irish priest and theologian pointed out: "Several decades ago, the great French Dominican theologian, Yves Congar, wrote: "I could quote a whole series of ancient texts, all saying more or less that if in one country Mass was celebrated for 30 years without preaching and in another there was preaching for 30 years without Mass, people would be more Christian in the country where there was preaching."

**WORD OF LIFE** *Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. (Matthew 10:40)* Jesus instructed the twelve: they had to set out barefoot and with little baggage: a light bag, a single tunic... They had to regard themselves as guests, willing to humbly accept the hospitality of others. They needed to freely offer care and support to the poor and leave the gift of peace with everyone they met. Like Jesus, they would be patient when faced with misunderstanding and persecution and sure the Father's love would help them. In this way, those who were fortunate enough to meet them would truly experience God's tenderness.

**Our Church** will be open for personal prayer following Government guidelines on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> June at 11.30. We begin small and often will review the situation. We do not know how many people will want to come to pray. Therefore, we will be flexible. we will increase the number of hours for people to come and pray if needed. The safety of all in this Pandemic is our guiding principle. Developments will be shown on posters in the window of the Church and on the Parish face book page. LEyland St Mary's RC Church 2020

**The Church will be open from 11.30-12.30 initially on two days a week: Sundays and Wednesdays.** Visits may have to be short in the first week; the volunteers will give guidance.

**We will expose the Blessed Sacrament on the High Altar,** but it will not be possible to kneel. There will be designated benches and only one Unit, (person, or one family unit) in each bench; 4 units will be in Church at any one time. The "units" must queue up two metres distanced to come in. We pray and hope for good weather. The volunteers will give clear instructions, e.g. the way in and the way out, keeping at two metres distance. The left-hand main door in, right hand door out; follow the one-way path. The glass corridor between Church and the Sacristy is locked to safeguard the Priory

**Those who come to pray** if they wish can wear a mask and gloves provided by the Church. Everyone will have their temperature checked, if it is high, they will be turned away. Those who are at 'clinical risk' of Covid-19 or have been advised to shield should not visit Church. Please do not visit the Church if you or someone in your house has a high temperature, a new, continuous cough, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell. People in that situation must stay at home and contact your GP or NHS 111 for further advice. There will be no toilets available, no candles, no literature.

*There will be the weekly bulletin available spread out on a table to take home if you wish as you leave.*

**Volunteers** They are essential to marshal, guide, clean where each person has been praying as soon as they leave, and generally help those who wish to come and pray. The first training is on Monday morning 15 June. More volunteers are welcome: apply to Lesley Raven in the Priory house or talk to a volunteer. You have to be in good health whilst performing your duties and you must ensure that if you or any member of your household feels unwell or present with any coronavirus symptoms that you must inform Fr Jonathan immediately, cease your duties and follow the government guidelines: "stay at home: guidance for households with possible coronavirus". You must sign a Volunteer Steward Declaration to that effect.

**Thank you** to those who came together to help get the Church ready for this. They have given time and energy. The Church has been deep cleaned without any cost to the parish in a long Leyland tradition

**Thank you** to the Archdiocese who have supplied us with important items, gloves, sanitizer, masks, paper to clean, and many signs and documents.
