**Our Way of Life** Peter and Paul are the pillars of our Church and surrounding them the other Apostles and their disciples. All are disciples of Jesus. **A Reflection** There is every day a discovery to be made about the relationship I have with God and the others who are a part of my life. Every day this relationship is changing and developing as things happen and change both in me and others and in what is going on around me. The Church is the Mystical Body of Christ who has a real and huge influence in everyday of life. Within each of us and together among us a real and mystical reality is being built up where there is truth, peace, joy and goodness, a foretaste of heaven. Be open to these great gifts of God, and do not get stuck in an earthly way of living, but in this godly way of living.

**WORD OF LIFE**

*Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. Mt 10:40*  
This is what Chiara Lubich wrote about welcome, as understood in the evangelical sense, "Jesus was the manifestation of the Heavenly Father's totally welcoming love for each one of us and of the love which, consequently, we should have for one another...We can begin to live this Word of life within our families, associations, communities and places of work. We can eliminate any sense of judgment, discrimination, prejudice, resentment, or intolerance towards our neighbours that we may harbour within. We often and easily acquire such attitudes which can undermine relationships; they are like a layer of rust that blocks mutual love...The acceptance of the other person who may be very different from us lies at the basis of Christian love. It is the starting point, the first step in the construction of that civilization of love, of that culture of communion, to which Jesus calls us today."

**Our Church will be open for personal prayer** following Government guidelines on Wednesday and Sundays at 11.30 to 12.30. The volunteers will give clear instructions about all the details.

**The Opening up of St Mary's Leyland for Worship together *Guidelines for Mass.***

On Monday 6 July, the Churches that are ready for it will be opening for worship together. This is a huge step forward since March and the lockdown: rejoice and thank God. We would like to open as well.

**Please do not expect** us to go back to things as they were before covid-19 and it will look and feel quite different. Catholic churches that have opened for personal prayer have put in place all the measures needed to ensure the risks of virus transmission are minimised. This is still the priority. Social distancing guidelines are still in force. This why in church every 2<sup>nd</sup> row will be closed off.

**The obligation to go to mass** on Sundays has not been restored. There will be a limit to those who may come to mass even in our very big Church. We expect the Sunday mass to be the largest. You are encouraged if you are free, to come to Church for mass on any weekday which counts like a Sunday. We will do our best to include everyone who wishes to come to mass at 10 am on Sunday morning as we doubt if our limit will be exceeded. The weekday mass counts for a Sunday at present. We have yet to decide whether we can have mass every day in Church; we are aiming at that. It does depend on more volunteers making themselves available to help us. By next Sunday we will be clearer whether we are able to have weekday masses every day. Please contact us in Church if you would be able and would like to volunteer for Church duties as a mass helper. We will do our best to continue the streaming we have begun from the Priory House Chapel both from Church and from the Chapel.

**All coming to mass must wear a face mask** that they remove to receive Holy Communion. Please bring your own. There will be volunteers to direct hand sanitising.

There will be no singing at mass for the time being.

**Holy Communion** will be distributed after the final dismissal of the mass. The words "The Body of Christ. Amen" will be said once at the beginning of distributing Holy Communion. The ushers will direct you to go to Holy Communion and the Volunteers will moderate the queue. Holy Communion will only be given on the hand. On the tongue is not allowed. We will learn to distribute Holy Communion using tongs and simply dropping the host onto the palm of the hand of the communicant keeping at two arms lengths. The priest or person giving Holy Communion will wear a see-through visor. After receiving Holy Communion, you will be directed to leave Church. Nobody goes back to the bench they were in and it will be important not to bring heavy shopping or large personal items to Church to avoid going back to the bench you came from.

**Votive candles** can be lit in Church but only from a lit candle. There will be tapers to help you.

**Other guidelines** for Funerals, Baptisms and Weddings. Also, Reconciliation or confession can begin again with some important guidelines in place. Please contact Sister Veronica for baptisms. Those already booked before lockdown will be baptised first. Contact the Church for everything else.
