Our Way of Life Today is Trinity Sunday. The Holy Trinity is not something remote and far away, but mysteriously and truly a part of ordinary life. In the early Church two texts were used to explain the Church. "Where two or more are gathered in my name there am I among you"; and "I will be with you until the end of time". Jesus will be much stronger in the Church if people can "see" him not just in each one of us individually, but in the community of faith. Church communities are in small cells everywhere; in families, parishes, schools, work-places etc. Many, but One. That is what a Church should be, especially gathering on Sundays though not only then; the Church should reflect the Holy Trinity in Unity and Diversity as a living experience each day, all day.

A Reflection The Holy Spirit will teach you everything; when I have gone I will send him to you. Jesus spoke those words before his Ascension, and then ten days later at Pentecost the Holy Spirit came. God is very close to us who are baptised and in the Church. He wants the Church to shine forth as a prophetic sign of unity and concord in a world torn by strife. We have seen a lot of violence this last week in the USA and many other parts of the world there is division and hatred, also on our streets, in our families and other places. The Word of Life will help and support us to enter the life of the Trinity. Make the text real for you in this month of June.

WORD OF LIFE *Whoever welcomes you welcomes me, and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. (Matthew 10:40)* Only after showing concrete signs of love for his people, to the sick, to sinners, to those considered to be possessed by evil spirits and to people on the margins of society who everyone else avoided and condemned did Jesus himself prepare to announce that the Kingdom of God was near. The apostles were, therefore, sent in the name of Jesus, as his "ambassadors". It is Jesus who must be welcomed through them. Often the great characters of the Bible receive a visit from God himself because they have opened their hearts to an unexpected guest. Even today, especially in cultures that maintain a strong sense of community, the guest is a sacred visitor and given the best place, even if he or she is unknown to the host.

A Reflection on hope by Pope Francis Where God has placed you, be hopeful. Be hopeful always. Don't surrender to darkness. This world is the first miracle that God has accomplished, and God has placed in our hands the grace of creating new wonders. Everything is born to flower in a land of springtime. God also made us to flourish. Wherever you find yourself, be creative. If you are on the ground, rise up; if you are sitting down, walk; if you are paralysed by boredom drive it out with good works. If you feel empty or demoralised, ask the Holy Spirit to refill your nothingness. Love people; love them one by one. Above all, be a dreamer. Don't be afraid to dream. God is your friend. Learn from the marvels around you, cultivate awe and wonder; cultivate awe and wonder. Live, love, dream, believe and with God's grace never despair.

This meditation that seems like poetic prose from Pope Francis may help us to overcome all negativity including racism; a little bit or a lot of it is in most of us, including me! Fr Jonathan
