"How can you remain so full of smiles when you have analysed with so much care and detail the disastrous world in which we live in Chapter 1 of "Fratelli Tutti"?" We can find the answer if we do not know it already, we find it in the title of his new encyclical. We will be able to manage everything if we as people of this good world stop being self-centred, preoccupied with MY situation, without realising the whole human family is one, in which EVERYONE is our brother and sister. We should be open to see others who are different as a new friend, There is a lot to be done. I would urge parishioners to buy a copy of the booklet and make your own observations on it, to realise God is still with us, and we have to find a new way of being Church, a new way to spread the Love that is God to ourselves in everyone else. The Liverpool Synod work will move us in the right direction.

WORD OF LIFE for October 2020 "*For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted*". (Lk. 14:11)

This is also a lesson where we learn how to build fraternity - where we learn to contribute to forming a community of men and women, adults and children, healthy and sick who are capable of building bridges and serving the common good.
