The NHS, Social Care and Frontline Services Day 2021 This very first National day takes place on Monday 5 July 2021, seventy-three years to the day since the start of the NHS. The country will celebrate the good work of all NHS workers, all working in the caring sector of residential nursing homes of all types for the elderly and sick, for the young with learning difficulties and all in the in between ages. All critical workers involved in essential national services to keep our country viable in a pandemic and included.

The Revd David Whitehouse and Fr Jonathan (St Andrew's and St Mary's) have each been asked to say a prayer for this occasion. We have agreed that the prayers will be inclusive, representing all churches in South Ribble; all those of other faiths who believe in God, to all those who have no belief in God, and to all, especially of Good Will. All these different groups are represented in South Ribble and in the NHS, and some from all groups will have given their lives working in the NHS or as other Carers or in essential services.

Parishioners main Preferences for the Synod. The voting for the Synod took place on Saturday 19 June on a zoom meeting at which there would be 500 + members. Our Members are Fr Jonathan, Fr Bernard, Eileen Jackson, Kevin Flanagan and Jason Crompton married to Rachel our altar server. The main preferences of the 19 presented to us (with some objections) of parishioners were: The final preferences of the Synod members will undoubtedly be told us later or may be online after the Saturday voting.

1. **Young People and Young Adults** We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan include a plan to assist parishes in understanding, meeting, forming and welcoming young people and young adults, and developing locally employed and volunteer youth ministers to work with young people and young adults.
2. **A More Inclusive Church** (No. 4b) We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan include dialogue with those who feel excluded, in order to develop initiatives so that the whole Church can reflect on what it means to be more inclusive.
2. **Catholic Schools** (No. 8a) We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan include dialogue with those who feel excluded, in order to develop initiatives so that the whole Church can reflect on what it means to be more inclusive.
2. **Catholic Schools** (No. 8b) We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan include the promotion, support, and strengthening of chaplaincy in all our secondary schools, colleges, and further education institutions.
2. **Love of Neighbour** (No.13) We, the people of the Archdiocese, recommend that the pastoral plan include training for parish volunteers who can accompany those most in need; giving special attention to those who are housebound, sick, or immigrants, and to those who are members of cultural and ethnic minorities.
