We seek to provide high quality accommodation to people in need. We have a two-bedroomed house available below market rent in the centre of Leyland. It is currently being redecorated throughout to a very high standard and has recently had a new bathroom and kitchen fitted. Downstairs is a living room and a kitchen-diner, and a downstairs toilet. Upstairs are two bedrooms (one large double: one smaller single) and a bathroom with accessible walk-in shower. There is a paved private patio to the rear of the house. The house currently has a stairlift which can be removed if not required. Available from mid-July. Whilst the trust is connected to the church, we welcome expressions of interest from people of all faiths and none. The weekly maintenance charge for the house is £95 per week (£380 per calendar month). Dare to Care. URGENT Please support the Right to Life.

The abortion lobby, led by the UK's largest abortion provider, BPAS, has worked with Diana Johnson MP to bring forward an amendment to hijack the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill to **introduce abortion on demand, for any reason, up to birth** to England and Wales.

This would be the single biggest change to abortion legislation since 1967 and would leave England and Wales with one of the most extreme abortion laws in the world.

Right to Life is an excellent and good charity that states the case very clearly, but with no anger, just sadness and worry at what might happen if people do not take head. 'And behold, Jesus turns, looks at her and reassures her: her faith has obtained salvation. Not only physical health: Jesus' gaze brings about an encounter with God's love.
