**Daring to Care** On Monday 9 August at 6.30pm there is a Pax Christi memorial service for a remarkable Austrian man called Franz Jägerstätter. He never became a Nazi and he was executed for his principles in 1943. In an official document of the Reich court martial it states "that, due to his religious views, he refused to perform military service with a weapon, that he would be acting against his religious conscience were he to fight for the Nazi State...that he could not be both a Nazi and a Catholic... that there were some things in which one must obey God more than men, Due to the commandment 'Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself', he said he could not fight with a weapon. However, he was willing to serve as a military paramedic." Franz was executed by the guillotine on 9<sup>th</sup> August 1943. Franz was in fact not a learned man, but a simple peasant farmer who was very aware of what he was doing, and what were the consequences in those days. He has already been beatified in the Austrian City of Linz on 26 October 2007 by Pope Benedict XVI. A person who was present commented: *"There were many consoling, inspiring and uplifting moments last Friday, Oct. 26, in Linz, Austria, at the beatification of the anti-war hero Franz Jägerstätter. The resounding applause for his 94 year-old widow Franziska. The reading of the declaration. The unfurling of the 30 foot banner with Franz's photo and the sight of dozens of bishops and cardinals standing up, looking up -- at last! -- to Franz. But the most moving was the presentation of his relics. Franziska kissed them, gave them to a cardinal for the cathedral in Linz, then wept. She knows it now. Franz no longer belongs to Austria. Now he belongs to the world. And his work is just beginning."* Franziska died in 2013 after she was 100 years old. Franz's faith developed in 1935 when he met Franziska Schwaninger, a farmer's daughter. They married on Holy Thursday, 1936. At his suggestion, they travelled to Rome for their honeymoon. Together, they ran the Leherbauernhof farm. His marriage marked a turning point in Franz Jägerstätter's life. According to his neighbours, he became a different man. Franz and Franziska prayed together, and the Bible became their book of reference for everyday life. Franziska says of this time: "We helped one another go forward in faith." From 1941, Franz Jägerstätter was also the sacristan at St. Radegund. Three daughters were born to the couple: Rosalia (1937), Maria (1938) and Aloisia (1940). Franz Jägerstätter once said: "I could never have imagined that being married could be so wonderful." It was his renewed faith that made Franz stand out to be utterly radical in his beliefs. *To Register and be a part of the Pax Christi service on Monday at 6.30 pm please type in your search engine: Pax Christi prayer for Franz Jägerstätter. **Word of Life** **Whoever becomes humble like this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.** Jesus contrasts a competitive and self-sufficient mentality with the weakest and most vulnerable element in society – the person who has no role to boast about or defend and who is totally dependent and spontaneously relies on the help of others. However, this is not an invitation to be passive or to avoid proactive and responsible behaviour; it is a freely taken act of will. Jesus invites us to 'become small', like children and this requires intention and commitment from us if we are to make a decisive change.
