Whether it's food, money, or time we can be astounded by the generosity of those who seemingly have very little. Jesus breaks us down to our very core; he asks us what are our motivations? Is it faith that motivates us, or property and wealth? Is it the people around us or the home comforts? We may find comfort in busy lives, material goods and property. We can find it hard to give this up and live a simpler life, but we don't need to do it all at once. One step at a time to a simpler life, take our Live Simply schools and parishes as an example. So, what step can any one of us take today? Am I willing to give up the time to write a letter to my MP or to sign a petition, or am I ready to welcome the next person who appears on my doorstep for a chat? All Jesus asks is that we give of ourselves, from our hearts, and more than we think we can, to our brothers and sisters, especially those most vulnerable.

Daring to care for Prisoners in Prisons Week, 10-16 October This is a reflection from a Prisoner. It could easily be written by one in Garth Prison where for the past 2 weeks we have had the privilege to celebrate mass after 1 year and 7 months without the mass. In Wymott they await the chaplain. *LETTING GO Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Hebrews 12:1* I was down and thinking of behaviours before I decided to let go, let God heal and restore. I'd done drugs, sex and violence in the past to cope. But they all left me empty, and no feeling of hope. When I read through the scripture, something happens in me - I want to do good things and be with God's family. You can't change the past, but the future you can. If you're looking for hope, then God has a plan

How, then, should we welcome and accept this demanding proposal in our everyday lives? Focolare founder, Chiara Lubich, suggested: *'First of all, we must never stop at the purely external, material or worldly aspect of things, but believe that every fact is a message with which God expresses his love for us. We will then see how life which may seem to us like a piece of material that is full of knots and threads woven together in a haphazard way, is, in reality, something else: it is the marvellous design that God's love is weaving on the basis of our faith.*
