Please feel free to add your own eco tips, we can learn from each other. *We hope you will add some simple pledges to the board such as being more active; walk instead of using the car when possible, turn off unnecessary lights; don't let the tap run while you are brushing your teeth, save boiling water in a thermos to heat up again; use less fossil fuels. Eat locally produced food, have a vegetarian day at least once per week. These all help to go forward for the environment.*

Word of Life Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation. (Mark 15:15)

The community sent by Jesus to continue his mission was, therefore, not a group of people who were perfect; instead, they were people called to "be" with him, to experience his presence and his patient and merciful love. Then, only by virtue of this experience, were they sent to "proclaim to every creature" that God is close to them. The success of the mission certainly does not depend on personal abilities but on the presence of the Risen Lord who entrusts himself to his disciples and to the community of believers, in which the Gospel grows to the extent that it is lived and proclaimed. What we can do as Christians, therefore, is to proclaim God's love with our lives and words. We can reach out to others with courage and generosity and offer to everyone, with sensitivity and respect, the treasures of the Risen Lord that open our hearts to hope.
