Preston Ecumenical Service: Sunday at 3pm on Avenham Park. Tickets valid till 2.30pm when all who can get in will get in. Archbishop of Westminster and others will be present. Aled Jones will comper the event. Please collect your tickets.

Preston Guild Christian Procession will be on Monday September 3rd at 2pm.

- We hope many will attend a completely new concept of a Christian procession which is for all the floats to illustrate "The Living Christ" - Those who attend are as important as those who walk or are on vehicles. It should be a fabulous day out.
- There are 60 vehicles and 5,000 people in the procession. The vehicles begin and end in Moor Park. It comes down the A6 towards town, veering into Moor Lane, turning left leading onto the Ringway, by the Flag Market and in front of Preston Town Hall, down onto Fishergate, turning right towards the Preston Railway station, turning right at Corporation Street back to Moor Lane and back to Moor Park.
- The theme "The Living Christ" will be shown in the following sections:
 - The Resurrection - L' Arche
 - The Christ of the Cosmos - Churches together in Ribbleton
 - Jesus of Nazareth: Who was he? What did he do? What did he say? Churches together in Bamber Bridge, Churches together in Fulwood and Broughton.
 - The Crucifixion as above.
 - The Holy Spirit - Brock Valley Churches together; Churches together in Penwortham
 - The Body of Christ - Churches together in Ingol; Churches together in Leyland (illustrating the Our Father)
 - The Living Christ in people - Plunginton Churches Together.
 - The Living Christ in the city - Preston City Centre Churches.
 - The Procession ends with "The Fisherman's Friends Jazz band".
- The advice is to take public transport to Preston if you wish to attend. Please look after your own children.
- The whole procession is very carefully organised and there will be amenities along the way.
- There are many other events in the Preston Guild. Please look up on the internet if you wish to know more.
