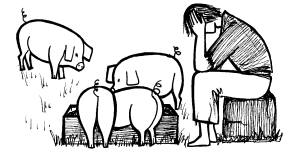

Abbot presides at a special mass 07.45 on Tuesday 17th September for all pupils, teachers and parishioners on the occasion of his visit to the Parish to see for himself what has happened during the tragic fire at the High School and to pray with us for all affected by our local tragedy. This will be a chance for him as Chair of Trustees of Ampleforth to be involved in our Ampleforth Trustee School, here within the Archdiocese of Liverpool. In practice we operate in our schools in full communion with the Archdiocese and the LEA, and have our own Ampleforth Benedictine contribution to make in all that pertains to our schools. All are welcome to come and pray with the good Lord among us.

This last week the head, the senior management team and teachers have worked very hard to make it possible to have the whole school in Ribbleton, Preston.
