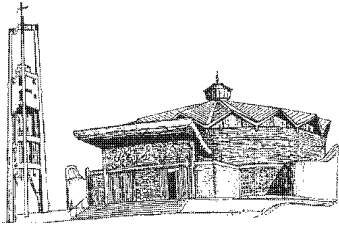

WORD OF LIFE

You shall love your neighbour as yourself (Mt 22:39)

Jesus repeated this principle and added that the command to love one's neighbour is *like* the first and greatest commandment, namely, to love God with all one's heart, mind and soul. In affirming how similar the two commandments are, Jesus conclusively bound them together, as does the whole of Christian tradition. As the Apostle John states so clearly: "Those who do not love the brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen" (Jn 4:20). As the entire Gospel shows, 'our neighbour' means every human being, man or woman, friend or enemy, to whom we owe respect, consideration and esteem. Love of neighbour is both universal and personal. It embraces all humanity and takes concrete shape in the person next to you.
