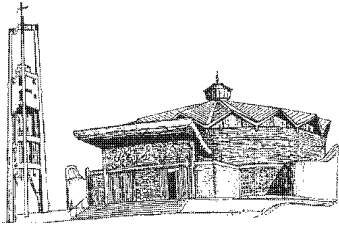

Confirmations in 2011 will be the last time we have these in the Archdiocese at High School age and they take place on Sunday 27th March 2011 with Bishop Tom Williams. After consultation with priests and people the Archdiocese will return to the original order for sacraments, of Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion and this will happen in 2012. Reconciliation will occur at a time to be explained later. THEREFORE we will offer confirmation to both year 10 and year 9 in the High School for those who wish it, and of course those above in age for any who wish to be confirmed. Anyone above this age needs to contact Fr. Jonathan or Lesley. Those of High School age must take a letter that they can get from Church or from School (Mrs. Matthews, Mrs. Mills or Mrs Hardwick).

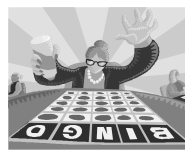
Parishioners in hospital - please let us know if family or friends are in hospital and then the Priests can visit them when they are in hospital. Let us know the hospital and ward.
