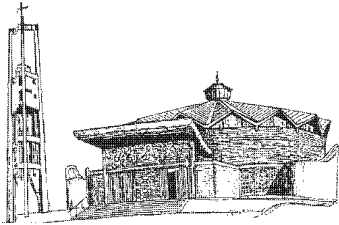

24th November 2012**

A Day for Sharing: Sunday has been a day of sharing with the poor since early Apostolic times. "On the first day of the week, each of you is to put aside and save what extra you have." (1 Cor 16:2) (DD 70)

The early Apostles saw the connection between celebrating the Eucharist and sharing with those who were poor. What good is it, said St John Chrysostom, if the eucharistic table is filled with gold chalices when Christ himself, our sister and brother, is dying of hunger?
