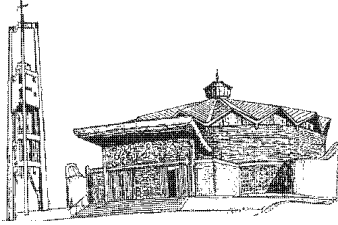

This Christmas (HSBC Survey)
