The Church and the Poor

"Whatever you do the least of your brothers and sisters, you do to me" Mt 25: 40 In the Catholic Catechism we read: (2443) God blesses those who come to the aid of the poor and rebukes those who turn away from them...It is



by what they have done for the poor that Jesus Christ will recognise his chosen ones. (2444) The Church's love for the poor ... is a part of her constant tradition. Love for the poor is even one of the motives for the duty of working so as to 'be able to give to those in need'.... It extends not only to material poverty but also to the many forms of cultural and religious poverty.

(2445) Love for the poor is incompatible with immoderate love of riches or their selfish use. (2446) St John Chrysostom vigorously recalls this: 'Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours but theirs' Cardinal Newman was not only a great intellectual and author,

but he was also a pastor. At his funeral 15,000 people lined the streets of Birmingham. Many of them were the poor people of Birmingham who loved their Cardinal because he loved them.

Next week the parish will hear about the proposed parish Newman fund.
