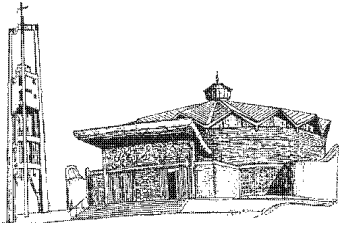

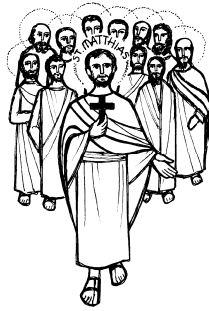

100 years of the ecumenical movement "As we celebrate the centennial of the World Missionary Conference at Edinburgh, 1910, we seek to deepen and strengthen its prophetic vision of worldwide, multi-cultural Christian unity--a unity marked by shared passion to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ. The memory of Edinburgh 1910 reminds us that we are ambassadors of hope, confident in the power of God's love despite our limitations in

a world of pain and injustice." See the website at www.edinburgh2010.org 1910 marked the beginning of the ecumenical movement. There will be an hour of worship and praise organised by *Churches Together in Lancashire* in our Church Saturday 22nd May 2-3pm. All are welcome. This event will help us into Pentecost Sunday (23rd May) because the Holy Spirit is inspiring the Churches to pray, live and work for unity. Let us try to fill the Church. A choir of 200 will be leading us.

Visit of Pope Benedict to Britain in September See our website (Documents) for a message from the Archbishop. The Church is having to find money to pay for its share of the Pope's visit (which is a State visit this time), and so **on Pentecost Sunday** there will be an extra retiring collection for this purpose in every parish in Britain.

Cardinal Kasper President of the Pontifical Council for Christian Unity will be with us **on Pentecost Sunday** celebrating Mass in the Cathedral at 11am, and for the two Cathedrals' walk.; this year it begins at the Anglican Cathedral at 3.00 and it is there that the Cardinal will give the sermon.

WORD OF LIFE

Those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them. (Jn 14:21)

Such a revelation of Jesus, however, requires love. It is unthinkable for a Christian not to have this dynamism, this driving force of love in their hearts. A watch doesn't work, doesn't tell the time, and you can say it isn't even a watch, if it has no spring or battery to drive it. It's the same with Christians. If they are not always striving to love, they don't deserve the name of Christian. The reason for this is that all of Jesus' commandments can be summed up in one: love of God and love of neighbour in whom we recognise and love Jesus. Love is not just a matter of feelings, but is to be translated into real life, in serving our brothers and sisters, especially those near us, beginning with the little things, the most humble acts of service.
