

Marble on the Altar. The Marble is still looking remarkably well, since the refurbishment last year. We are cleaning it with the special material supplied by the Marble specialists. But we need to be vigilant to keep it that way. Please be conscious of shoes that they have no exposed metal on the sole or heel and be careful of chairs and other objects we put on the Altar. This way it should stay beautiful for many years to come. Thank you for your help and consideration in this important matter.

Pastoral Council Nominations This year there are six places available for the PPC. Parishioners may nominate people to serve

on the PPC. Think carefully if you would like to support the Parish in this important way. You will find nomination forms in the Narthex. Each nominee needs a proposer and a seconder. Nomination will end on Friday 19th June, and the election - if required - will take place on the weekend July 4th / 5th after we have profiles of candidates for all to see on the board.

Reverence in Church - it is always important that we give due respect to God when we are in Church, reverencing the altar as we come in and go out, genuflecting in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, and participating in the mass by being quiet and reflective during it. The following may help to keep it all in balance: it was seen inside a church in Lancaster Diocese.
BEFORE MASS *talk to God.* **DURING MASS** *listen to God.*
AFTER MASS *talk to your neighbour.*

Melchior and Ethel Singo, 15 Argyll Road with the two children, Olga and Renee, citizens of Malawi, regularly at mass with us, joyful members of our parish and the children loved by all at St. Mary's Primary School, were taken away by the border authority on Wednesday 13th May at 7am as their asylum status has been summarily rejected. The Home Office removal order is for this coming Tuesday on a Kenya airways flight from Heathrow at 8pm. There is danger to Mel's life if he goes back to Malawi, and this is a grave concern. We are doing all we can to delay this removal, to give time to prepare some miracle way that they will return to us after a successful appeal. They have been denied the chance to appeal so far. We have written to the Home Secretary, been in touch with the MP David Borrow who has been very open to our concerns. We have employed a solicitor and made many, many phone calls on behalf of this lovely family who have been so much a part of our worshipping community. They have been in touch with us by phone, and are very grateful for all we are doing for them. They send us their love and prayers and we assure them of ours. *They tell us that our love and concern has been a proof of God's Love for them whatever happens to them in the future.*

How can we support them? Not by any publicity in the press which would further endanger their lives if they are forced to return to Malawi.
