WAY OF LIFE

Called Beyond has deeply affected some of our parishioners. It is a part of our way of Life.

Where do we go from here??? The Vision of Called Beyond is not just words of a Vision Statement. Rather The Vision given through living the experience of our "Called Beyond Week", whose aim was precisely to give an insight of it. It is a vision that includes particular people and a particular context. St Mary's Parishioners living in the world of 2017 – a very different world from 1967. Parishioners of St Marys Leyland will have some different approaches to other parishioners. For one thing they have to live with priests who are Ampleforth Benedictine Monks. The Vision develops as it is lived out and events happen.

For Called Beyond (as with Jesus himself) people are invited to respond or not as they wish; it is a free personal response implying no judgments. Those parishioners who responded to the anonymous questionnaire reflect what they felt. We know that a silent majority did not reply to the questionnaire. We do not know what they thought of the week 8-15 October. Each person is entitled to their own opinion

The great majority of those who responded told us they were grateful, enthusiastic and in some cases deeply affected positively. Let us all thank God for a strengthening of faith for some people.

Every parishioner, whatever their view, is a part of the Body of Christ, i.e. The Church in Leyland St Mary's; the views of everyone are to be respected and important. There is no inner clique of the initiated or special, just ordinary people living out their vocation as we all do in our everyday lives.

On Thursday 9 November at 7pm in the Parish Centre we will try to set up a group of parishioners **to move Called Beyond forward**. Those who wish may come and hear concrete plans: and freely or not respond.

WORD OF LIFE *'The greatest among you will be your servant'* Matt 23:11
Jesus was speaking to the crowds that followed him, telling them what was new about the way his disciples lived. Their lives went against the current in comparison to the usual way of thinking of the time. In Jesus day and today too it was easy to speak in high moral terms and then not live accordingly, seeking prestige in society and wanting to be noticed, or using others for personal advantage. Jesus asks his disciples to have a completely different logic when relating to others, as he himself had.
