<u>OUR WAY OF LIFE</u> The Word of God today underlines an aspect of wisdom; it is not easy to enter the Kingdom of God if you are rich. A person can be rich in four basic ways with many varieties within each category: money, pleasure, power and honour. These can be the false gods that can prevent God being free to enter our lives. Even people who have not much money might be rich in one of the other three ways; and all four may go together. These false gods are temptations for us and we need to handle them well and not let them take over our lives if we want God to unite with us and be our best friend.

# **A REFLECTION**

For the law of love to lay solid foundations a person must learn to love everyone. Some find it hard work to love the rich for instance: Jesus looked steadily at the rich young man in the gospel and loved him. Some cannot abide the poor: Jesus, who was poor himself, had a special love for the poor but he did not cut off the rich. He includes *everyone* in the world and Jesus was the one who went out of his way to love people taking the initiative and not waiting for them to love him. He includes enemies, those who are objectionable, and those who seem to be unlovable. We need the presence of God within and among us to achieve such a high kind of love; this love is not human but divine. It is available for us. Ask God for it.

# WORD OF LIFE But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law

The love that comes from God urges us to always act responsibly - with our family, at work and with whoever we meet. We are called to build relationships that are peaceful, just and lawful. The law of love lays solid foundations for our life in society.
