OUR WAY OF LIFE It is often the faith of the humble widow that Elijah and Jesus met that inspires other members of the Mystical Body of Christ, including priests and consecrated men and women to continue in the journey of faith each day. That is how the majority of the Church, the lay people are missionary disciples.

A REFLECTION The Word of God became flesh and he was humbler than any other human being; in his time not one Apostle or disciple save possibly Mary his Mother had an inkling of the greatness of Jesus. Only by God's grace can I know and love him before I can become a missionary disciple. I need to accept with a trusting love the entire circumstances of my life today that he permits or wills to be mine; Then I together with others of the same mind can proclaim the mighty deeds God does for me and us as Mary did and God will help others to understand.

WORD OF LIFE *Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me.* (Rev. 3: 20).

Just like the Church in Laodicea to whom this section of the Apocalypse was addressed concerns us. Now too, the whole Christian community is asked to overcome fear, division and a false sense of security, to welcome the coming of Jesus. In fact, he comes to us every day in different "guises". These might be our daily sufferings, the difficulties we face in being faithful to the Gospel, or challenges concerning important choices we make in life. Above all, he comes to us in the people we meet around us.

It is also an invitation to each of us to "spend time" with Jesus in a personal conversation, as you would with a friend during a quiet evening, sitting at table together. That is the best time for a conversation that calls for openness and listening.
