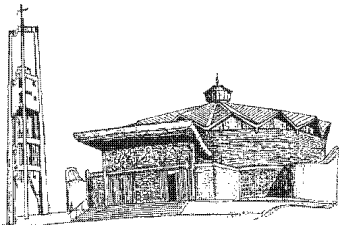

KEEPING WARM IN CHURCH

Much hard work since Christmas! *a technical team* working out HOW it can be done, *and a finance team* working out HOW we will pay for it.

There will be three manageable phases. The work depends on planning approval and the funding. Each stage stands alone. You will find these phases explained in last week's bulletin on the website, or on the display in Church. We must have a new efficient heating system in place by next winter.

Money raised since last week

We have received already since 24 March £1,600. This has been allocated to pay for the VT fixing valves (£636.60) and two shut off valves (£37.91 each).

This leaves £890.58 that will go into the general fund.

Pledges of Money as marked on the board since 24 March comes to £1591.46.

1 circulating pump for the air handling unit at £824

6 shut off valves at £37.81

Syria Crisis We have received a heart-rending appeal: since last week the number of Syrian Refugees has risen from 2.5 million to 3 million. A story from the CAFOD website:

Every day, thousands of Syrians who can escape the violence are streaming across into Lebanon, Turkey and Jordan. Rahaf is one of more than a million people who have fled Syria. She told the story of her escape to our partners in Jordan:

"We had a normal life. We went to university. We had friends. We were even a little spoiled by our parents. And then suddenly we had nothing. We were cold, hungry and alone.... My father received a phone call saying he should leave or he would be killed. We left the house straight away, without time to pack. We learned that our house was burned down later. We fled along back roads and through fields to avoid checkpoints. We walked across the border."

To support our Syrian brothers and sisters we will have a second collection at Easter as if we are to be authentic and have the means, we must be concerned and do something for those who suffer. Fr. Jonathan hopes to send our money directly to those dealing with the many refugees in Lebanon. He knows a Jesuit who was in Syria at Homs and for health reasons is now living in the Jesuit community in Lebanon.

The risen Jesus will look after our own needs if we also are generous to the poor wherever they are, at home or abroad.

God of mercy, pour out your peace upon us all. Watch over our brothers and sisters in Syria, especially those who have fled their homes. Lead them to a place of safety and bring comfort to those who mourn. Inspire us all to share the light of your hope, and to reach out in a spirit of compassion. Make us channels of your peace, so all your children may live free from fear, conflict and pain. We ask this through Christ our Lord, Prince of Peace, Amen.
